I liked the Carey (2004) reading because it really helped me grasp the concept of bootstrapping and used language and explanations that were quite accessible.

## What was your least favorite reading and why?

The textbook -- I thought the textbook was good for earlier chapters, but once we moved into the material after the midterm, a lot of the readings were off-putting for me. It painted low-income and minority families in a bad light, and while it was nice to read a book that actually tried to address the issues that these communities face, I thought some of the choices made were in poor taste. This is probably less of a problem with the book and more of a problem with the field in general, but the readings left me feeling a bit on edge. It also seemed to me that the book presented certain statistics as fact and would not address how they may be biased. Some of the language used in the gender development section was also just flat-out wrong, which is weird for a book published fairly recently (i.e. lesbians necessarily being gender non-conforming). I think the book had many good parts, but there were just some things in there that made me really question the authors (which is not really my place, as I'm no expert in developmental psychology). I really did appreciate your effort to explain some of the issues within the book in class.

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## What was your favorite assignment and why?

I liked the game assignment, and felt like I learned a lot about the aspects that I talked about.

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## What was your least favorite assignment? What would you replace it with (something requiring similar effort)?

The reading responses were useful, but I found the grading to be confusing, and because of this, I found doing them quite difficult because I did not know what was expected of me. I would have rather done a longer reading response with a rubric than a few one-page responses.

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## Was my feedback on your assignments sufficient and helpful? Why or why not?

I could have used a bit more explanation of my errors on the reading responses, but overall the feedback was good.

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**Did you find the exams to be fair? What would you change about them and what would you keep the same?**

I thought the exams were quite fair. The midterm was a bit long, but I was able to finish it in time. I liked the set-up of the exam, and thought the questions fit in well with the material presented in the book and lectures.

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**Please reflect on my facilitation of student participation in class. What worked well? What didn't?**

I thought the strategies used worked well. I liked the in-class assignments because I was able to ask questions to my peers, which is useful for learning a topic in language that is a bit more accessible. I think the class was also a bit quiet just because it was a larger class, but for the most part, participation seemed to be well-facilitated.

**Did you find the lectures informative and interesting? What parts would you change and which would you keep the same?**

The lectures overlapped heavily with the book. I found the parts that digressed a bit from the book's material to be the most interesting.

**What would you say to a fellow student considering taking this class in the future?**

I would recommend the course because I felt like I got a very good introduction to developmental psychology! I would warn them of the book, however, because it was probably the worst part about the course. I would tell them to go to lectures, because they are engaging and show examples that help solidify concepts learned about in the reading. I would also tell them that the exams and assignments were fair and not super difficult.

A bit less overlap with the book in the lectures, but overall, I really enjoyed the structure of this course and felt as if it was one of the best psychology classes I've taken thus far!

What was your favorite reading and why?

I liked the Carey and Senghas readings because I'm very interested in those topics, but the Carey one was somewhat confusing. The Leslie and Keller ones were just interesting and pertinent in general and highly accessible.

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What was your least favorite reading and why?

I didn't like the Spelke and Kinzler reading specifically for the reading assignment because it was such an overall view, I couldn't see how someone could summarize it concisely. However, it was a pretty good overview. The textbook itself also really seemed to go downhill after chapter 7. It presented a lot of very basic information (which was also true of the first chapters, they repeated a lot of Intro Psych knowledge, but I always felt there was something new). I didn't like the treatment of minority groups (for instance, saying "Being African American" was a risk factor without carefully explaining that this was about the racism of society and not an inherent risk factor based on race) as well.

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## What was your favorite assignment and why?

The game assignment for sure. I was a little skeptical at first but I honestly felt like I learned so much about the topics I chose and it was a fun way to think about applying them to a specific game.

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## What was your least favorite assignment? What would you replace it with (something requiring similar effort)?

I understood the purpose behind the reading responses and I appreciated reading the articles but the super-super-short page limit was more difficult than any other part of the assignment. I understand brevity is a good thing, but I always felt frustrated that I could not adequately explain my experiment or other aspect because of the page limit. Another half page or page would have made the assignment so much easier without making it less effortful intellectually.

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## Was my feedback on your assignments sufficient and helpful? Why or why not?

The feedback was helpful, but I pretty much always wanted more, especially for the reading responses. For instance, on the first response I was told I should only discuss one topic/experiment with very little other critique, so I wondered if that was the only problem I had and why it had had such a big impact on my grade. Similarly, for the second one, it felt like there were only a few criticisms but the grade went down a lot.

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**Did you find the exams to be fair? What would you change about them and what would you keep the same?**

Yes, the exams seemed fair and reflected the material we did in class and read in the textbooks. There was nothing I thought came out of left field, so to speak. There was a lot of writing and I might have put more multiple choice on them, especially the midterm, just to cut down on writing, but I understand that less accurately assesses a student's understanding. I was surprised there seemed to be 0 questions on the different theories of cognitive development after a lot of focus on that in class. Otherwise, I thought they reflected the material quite well.

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**Please reflect on my facilitation of student participation in class. What worked well? What didn't?**

Sometimes people are just more reluctant to speak up than other times. I thought you did well with really thinking about and considering people's contributions. I also liked the in-class assignments because they were a good way to force interaction with the material without putting people on the spot.

**Did you find the lectures informative and interesting? What parts would you change and which would you keep the same?**

The lectures were good. I felt like I learned things and they were the most helpful for exams and assignments. I did think there was a LARGE overlap between lectures and the textbook. This was both good and bad. On one hand, I got all the material twice, so I always felt prepared and absorbed the information better. I also sometimes wasn't sure which specific, in-depth textbook information we needed to focus on, and hearing it in class told me that was important. On the other hand, the most boring parts of the lecture were the parts I'd already explicitly got from the book, and the most interesting parts were the experiments we talked about or the other concepts or aspects that weren't in the book.

What would you say to a fellow student considering taking this class in the future?

I would tell them it's a good, solid introductory course with good assignments and fair exams. I would mention that a lot of material overlaps with other psych classes, especially Psych of Lang and Intro Psych. I would tell them to not skip lectures.

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What recommendations would you give me as I prepare to teach this class again next year?

Honestly, I think the biggest two are both ones you may have little or no control over. The first is the textbook. It's entirely possible this is the best Developmental Psychology textbook there is. But if not, perhaps a better one could be assigned. The second is the difficulty level/newness of the material. There was very little material that was absolutely brand new to me. I felt a lot of time was spent going over things I already knew, then building on them. This ensured I understood the course material very well at the end but also meant I wished I learned more brand new stuff that is not included in Intro Psych. Again, though, a lot of psych concepts are very recent to me. This could be just a personal feeling.

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Do you think the material you learned in this course will affect your future education and Swarthmore and/or your future career/life path? If so, how?

Yes, I want to continue with developmental psychology and psychology in general.
